LifeLine

- Lifeline is a government program that subsidizes phone or internet services for low-income consumers, ensuring everyone can stay in touch
- The Lifeline program is only available to eligible consumers who can provide documentation demonstrating eligibility for the program
- o Only one Lifeline benefit is available per household, either wireless or landline

Information for Colorado Workers:

- Colorado Department of Labor & Employment (CDLE) Resources:
 - <u>Emergency Paid Leave Rule</u> This rule is meant to limit the spread of highly contagious disease and enables workers in at-risk occupations to access testing.
 - Unemployment Insurance During layoffs, all employees are encouraged to apply for unemployment insurance. Those who are job-attached (meaning workers will be expected to return after a separation of up to 16 weeks) should file as "job-attached."
 - Work-Share Program may allow certain employees who have reduced hours to claim partial unemployment benefits.
 - o <u>Layoff/Separations</u> assistance, information and resources
